

Not publishers but authors should play a key role in the copyright infringement

The copyright infringement between two publishers and Researchgate was reported (1). Authors, publishers, and Researchgate involve in this copyright infringement. Authors publish their papers through publishers. These days, publishers have been providing online services to researchers for accessing published papers where they make money but without sharing their profits with the original authors. In Amazon kindle scheme, authors can share their profits with Amazon. However, for authors, there is no peer-reviewed credit in their Amazon publications. Researchgate, a nonprofit organization is the world's largest academic social network service provider with giving a free access service of published papers to researchers (readers) in the world which are granted by the authors (researchers). Two publishers include the American Chemical Society (ACS) and Elsevier. The following scenario can be expected. If ACS and Elsevier share their profits with the original authors, the authors will have two choices: obtaining profits from publishers with no submission to Researchgate or no profits with submitting their papers to Researchgate. If ACS and Elsevier do not share with their profits with the original authors, more authors will submit more papers to Researchgate for publication sharing. Not publishers but authors should play a key role in this copyright infringement. In order to reduce paper submission by authors to Researchgate, publishers should share their profits with the original authors.
